

The PCC credential is ideal for established ACC coaches like you who want to continue on a path to gain expertise in coaching. Earning your PCC signifies that you have not only achieved proficiency in your understanding of the ICF Core Competencies and ICF Code of Ethics, but you also possess verified skills necessary for effective practice and partnership with clients. Plus, many coaches report that the process is a powerful journey of growth and self-discovery.

Your commitment to continuous learning sets you apart as a verified leader in the coaching industry. Every hour of dedication you put in now brings you closer to extraordinary success and fulfillment on your horizon.

This credential highlights substantial experience and distinguishes coaches who have demonstrated a strong commitment to providing coaching services as a primary focus of their professional practice. PCC coaches, recognized for their expertise in coaching, are also required to continually develop professionally to maintain their status as leading coaching professionals. This maintains the relevancy and trust in the credential and in each coach practitioner who holds it.

To be eligible, you must complete at least 125 hours of coaching education and gain 500 hours of client-coaching experience, including 450 paid hours, a written proficiency exam that is independently assessed, and complete 10 hours of mentor coaching with an eligible mentor coach. While rigorous, the program's rewards are immeasurable.

Earning your PCC equips you with the competence and confidence to reach your next level of personal growth and coaching capabilities.

Education Requirements:



Total Hours Required:
125 hours of coach-specific education

Eligible Programs: ICF-accredited Level 1 or 2 programs, CCE programs, or non-ICF-accredited programs.

Experience Requirements

Total Hours Required: 500 hours of coaching experience

Clients: Experience must be included with at least 25 clients

Recency: 50 of the hours must have occurred within the 18 months prior to application

Paid Hours: At least 450 of the 500 hours must be paid

Mentor Coaching Requirements

Total Hours Required: 10 hours of Mentor Coaching

Timing: Sessions must be spread over at least three months

Format: At least three of the 10 hours must be one-to-one with the mentor coach; the rest can be one-to-one or in a group

Mentor Qualification: The mentor must be a current ICF credential-holder at the PCC or MCC level

Performance Evaluation Requirements

Requirement: Candidates must pass a performance evaluation involving two recorded coaching sessions, each lasting between 20-60 minutes, with a regular client

Review: ICF assessors will review the sessions for compliance with ICF standards

Exam Requirements

Exam Type: Computer-based written exam

Exam Provider: The exam can be taken at a Pearson VUE testing center or online via OnVUE, Pearson's remote-proctoring service

Exam Content: Measures knowledge of the ICF definition of coaching, Core Competencies, and Code of Ethics

If you apply for a higher-level credential within one year of your current expiration date, you can maintain your current credential status for up to 12 months while your new credential application is being reviewed. This means there is no need for a separate renewal application or fees, allowing you to focus on your upgrade without interruption.

To level up your credential, you will complete the full appropriate PCC application. Education and coaching hours used for your ACC can be used towards your PCC. With each session, you're not just ticking a box — you're proving your proficiency and readiness to be recognized as a top-tier coach. Recording lots of sessions to review will help to reduce anxiety and serve as a tool for learning and growth. Reflective, intentional practice helps to reinforce the skills you are learning.
